The Salvation Army Adventure Corps program is a holistic Christian education experience for boys in grades first through eighth. It is split into two groups: Explorers, grades first through fourth, and Rangers, grades fifth through eighth. The goal is to help boys develop social and communication habits, decision making and life skills and character and leadership skills through a Biblical worldview. This is done by encouraging a sense of personal identity and character, Christian values and Biblical principles, physical, mental, spiritual and social development in a balanced environment for learning, developing and caring that is age appropriate and Christ centered.
